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NGAATI POURAAHUI

HIIONA MARAE

I ahu mai te ingoa Hiiona (Zion) i te Paipera Tapu.

WHAKAPAPA

E ai ki ngaa koorero, ko Pouraahui teetehi wahine naana te hunga kaainga i whakakotahi, heoi, ko Ngaati Pouraahui te hapuu. Mai i taua rautau me te ngarongaro haere i te maatauranga whakapapa, ko ngaa tuupuna e moohiotia whaanuitia ana i ngeenei raa, ko Te Katipa. Ka moe a Te Katipa i a Te Hinureina, ka puta ko Mahinui raatou ko Te Kiri, ko Whanga, ko Parani, ko Pouraahui, ko Hoomai.

WHENUA

Hiiona Marae is situated on 5 acres of land recorded as a block of Māori freehold land known as Waiwhakaata 3E4C Lot 2A in the Waikato Maniapoto Māori Land District.



TE AVANANUI

E ai ki ngaa koorero, naa Te Arikini Vaikai o Rarotonga i taakoha mai te ingoa, Te Avananui.

Te Avananui (Tuarua) was opened in October 1989 by Te Arikini Te Atairangikaahu.



PUNA AROHA PUNA KAI

Naa Nanny Paakira Hemara-Wahanui te wharekai i tapaa.

Puna Aroha Puna Kai was named by Nanny Paakira Hemara-Wahanui who was raised at the papakaainga. The name commemorates puna (springs) used for karakia and others for kai. Puna Aroha Puna Kai was opened in 1992.



PUNA KAI (KAAUTA)

A large garage was brought out to the marae in 1976, restored, and used as a wharemoa and wharekai until Te Avananui (Tuarua) was opened. The garage then became the wharekai. In 1991, the garage was restored into a kitchen and structurally connected to a new dining facility, known today as Puna Aroha Puna Kai.

MARAE ADMINISTRATION

Brief History

KAITIAKI WHENUA

Land Trustees

In 1982, the land known as a papakaainga was set aside as a Maaori Reservation known today as Hiiona Marae (refer attached Gazette Notice). Before then, the trustees of the day were the trustees of the land, who then became the marae trustees.

Thereafter, responsibility for marae administration was assigned to a working committee known as the Hiiona Marae Committee and its three subcommittees: Hiiona Marae Housie (fundraising); Hiiona Marae Rangatahi (projects); and Hiiona Marae Sports Club.

KAITIAKI MARAE

Marae Trustees

In 1999, the marae committee became the marae trustees. The subcommittees were dissolved.

The Trust Deed otherwise referred to as the Charter, was adopted in 1999 and subsequent alterations to the Charter were approved in 2002.

Today, there is only one committee, the Hiiona Marae Trustees Committee, which is governed by the policies set out in the Charter. As provided in Schedule II, annual marae projects are assigned to a 'projects committee' otherwise known as the working committee of the marae.

PUUTEA

Marae Funds

Up until 1995, other than koha, the weekly source of income for the marae was the fundraising proceeds from a housie held in Hamilton and run by the Housie Subcommittee for more than ten years. The housie was widely supported not just by the marae whaanau but the entire Hamilton community, and beyond.

The housie closed down in late-1994. The income, as a result of the efforts of those who ran and supported the housie for over a decade, are responsible for the buildings still standing at the marae.

From 1999 to the present day, the marae receives an annual dividend from the governing authority of Waikato Tainui known as Te Whakakitenga o Waikato Inc. (formerly Waikato Tainui Te Kauhanganui Inc.), to assist with maintenance. From time to time, the marae also receives capital grants from Te Whakakitenga to assist with marae development.

Other income includes koha, fundraising proceeds, and grants from local, regional and national funding providers to assist with marae projects.

PURSUANT to section 439 of the Maori Affairs Act 1953, the Maori freehold land described in the Schedule hereto is hereby set apart as a Maori reservation for the purpose of a meeting place, recreation and sports ground for the common use and benefit of the Ngati Porahui tribe and its sub-tribes.
